

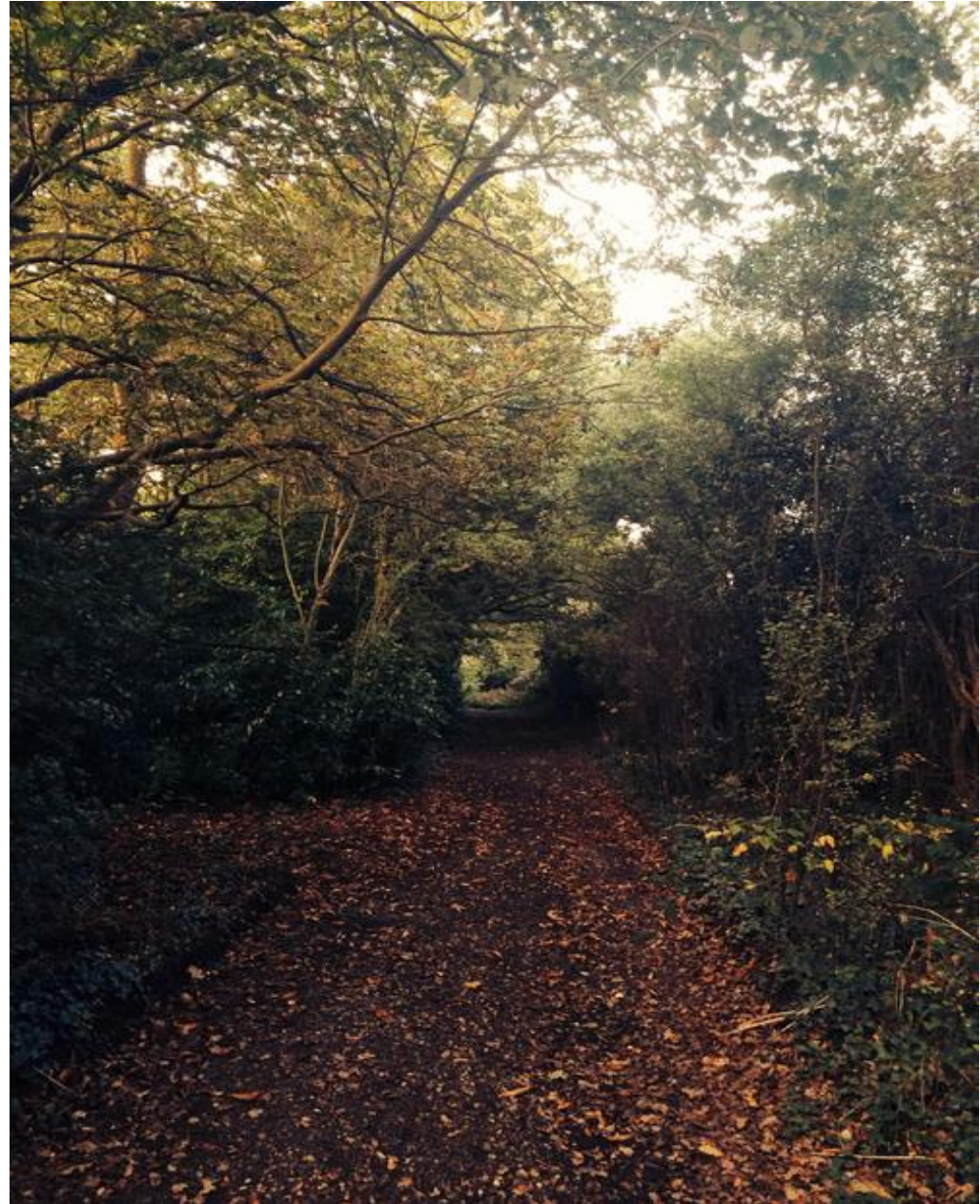
Why Irish and Dutch proverbs?

dag van morgen.***



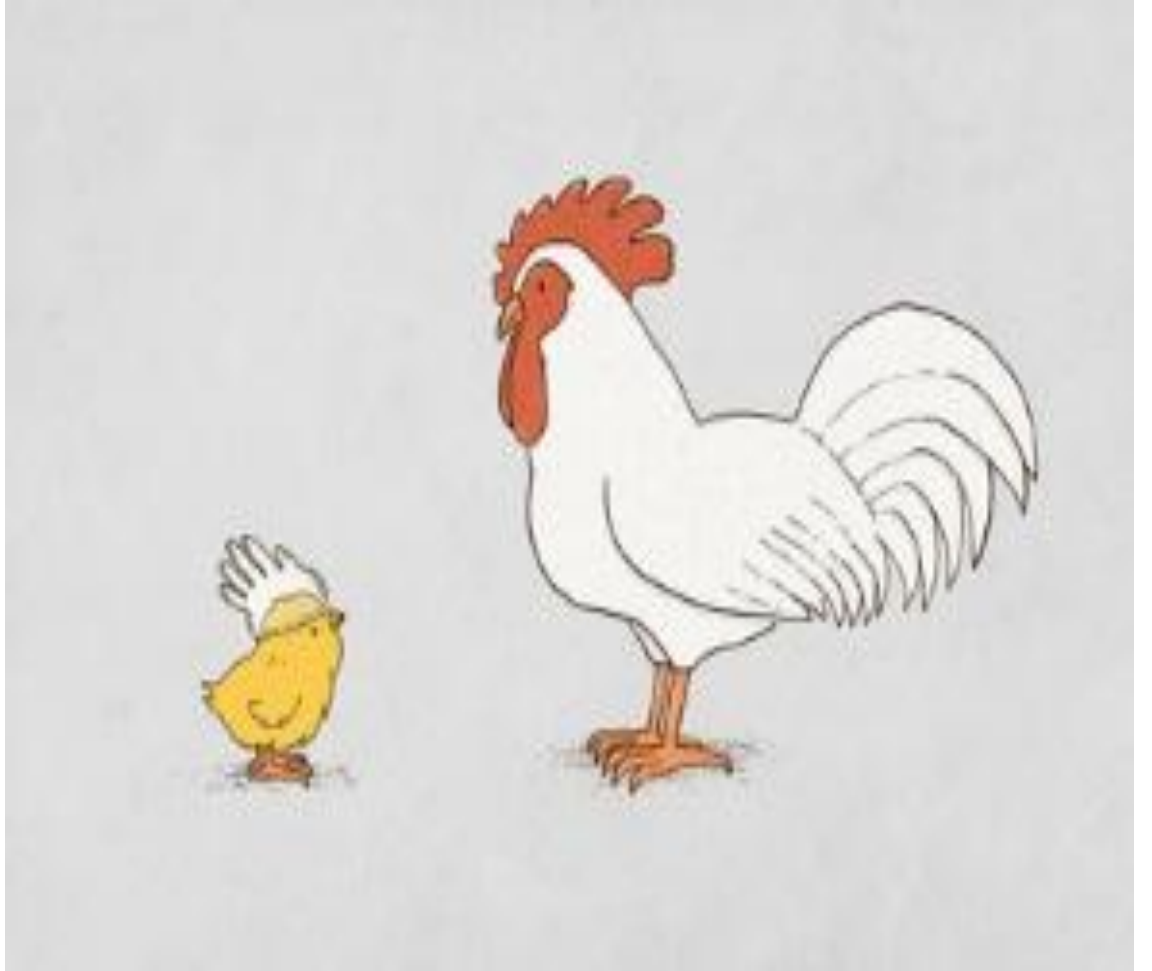
***It's often a mans

The old cock crows, the young cock learns

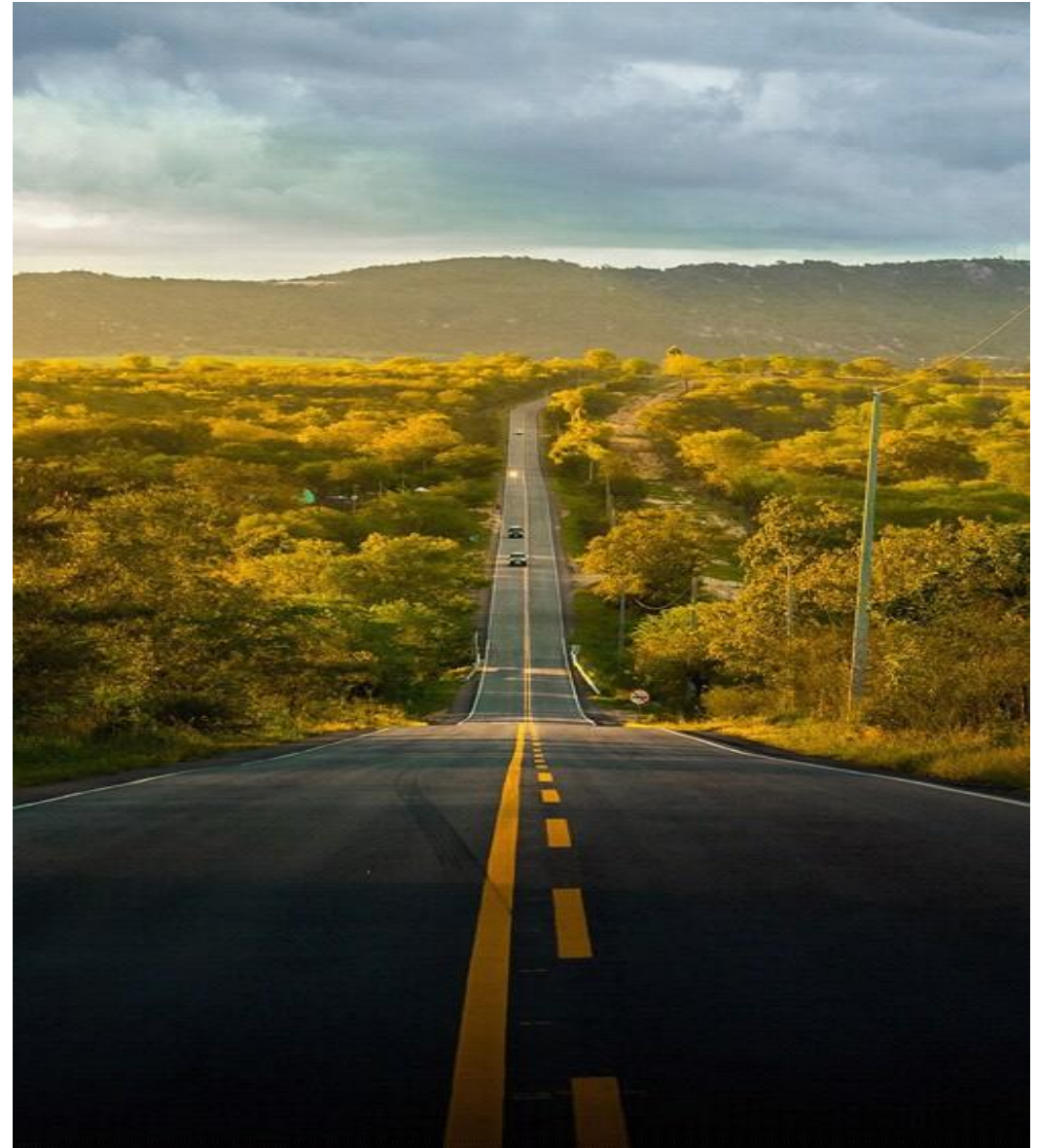
- Children learn from examples from older people like their parents or teachers.
